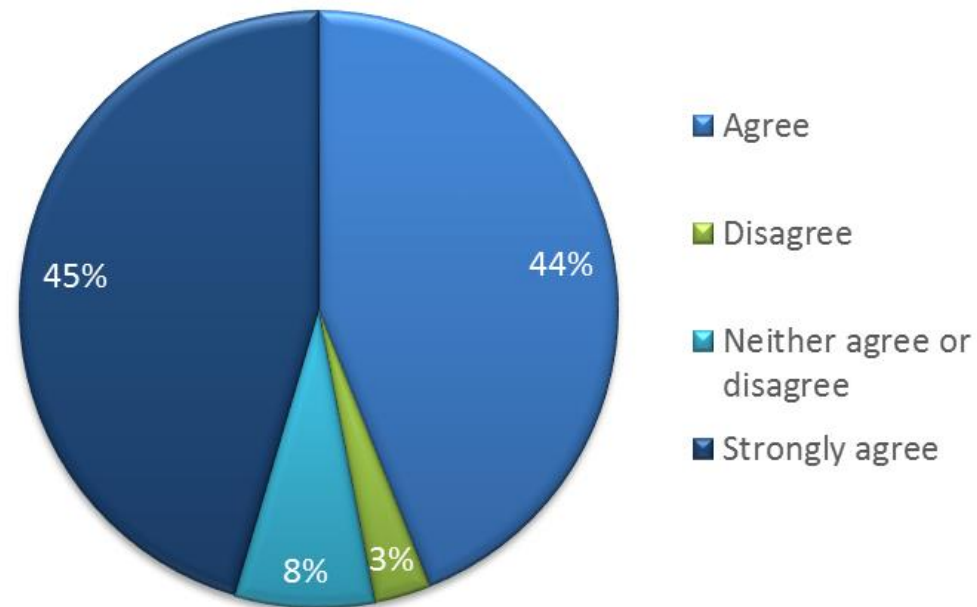

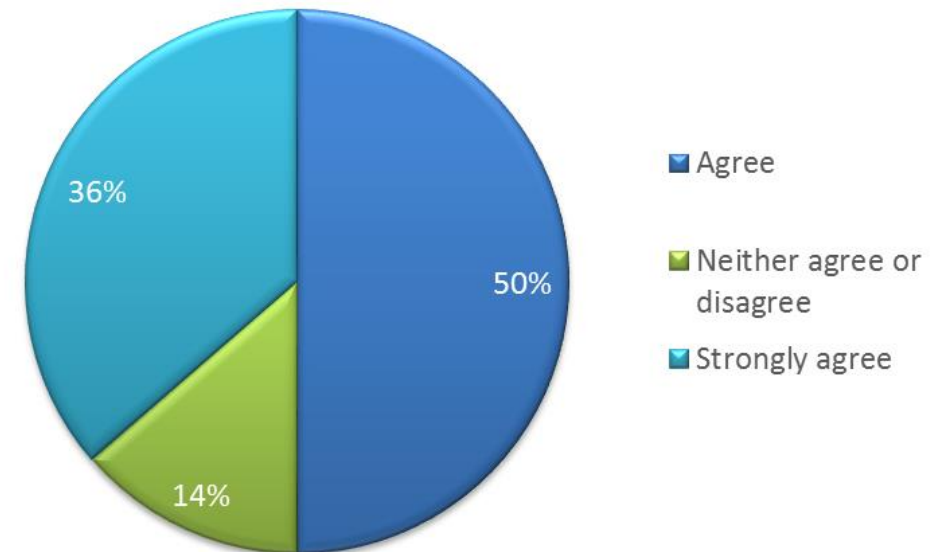

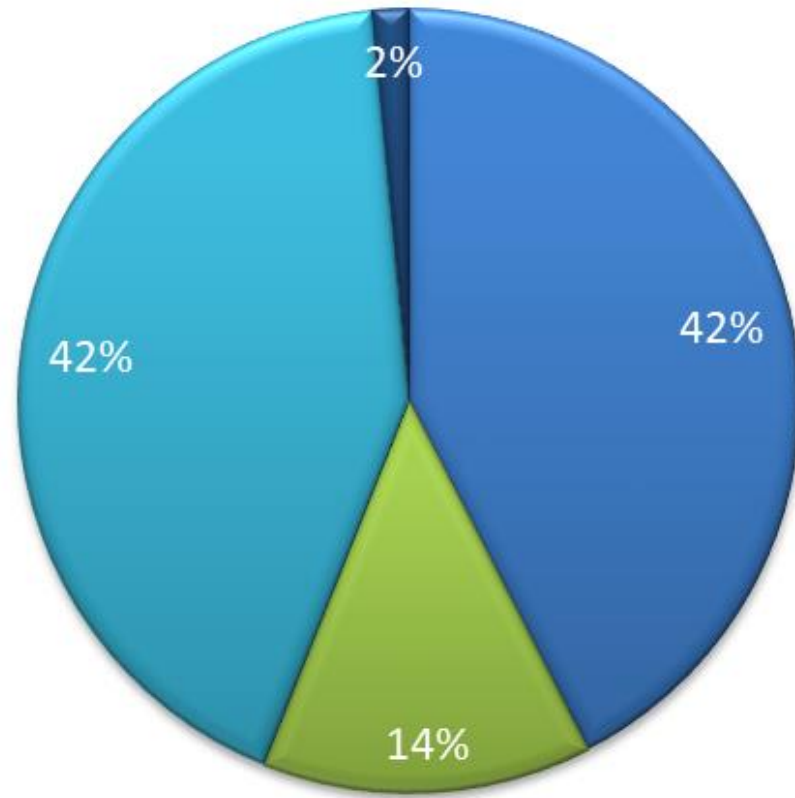

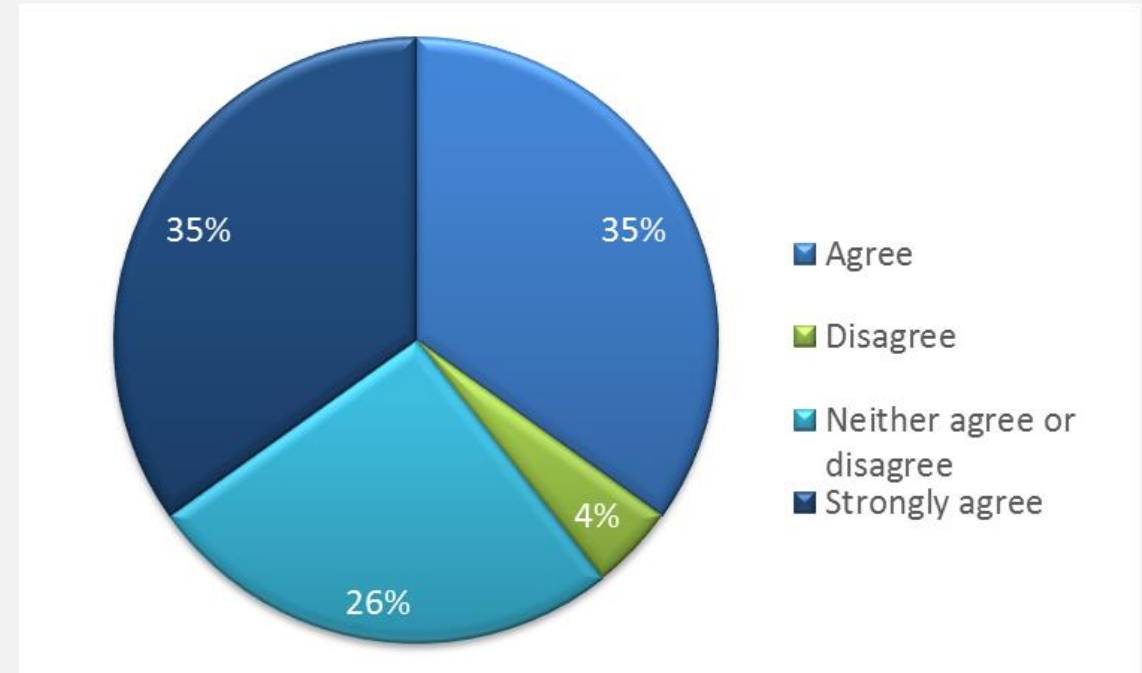

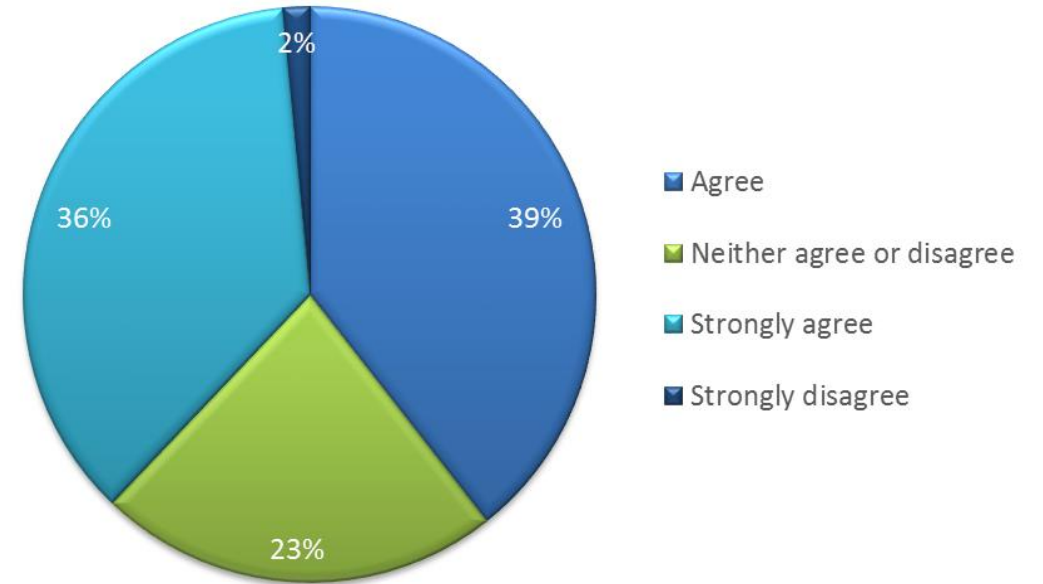

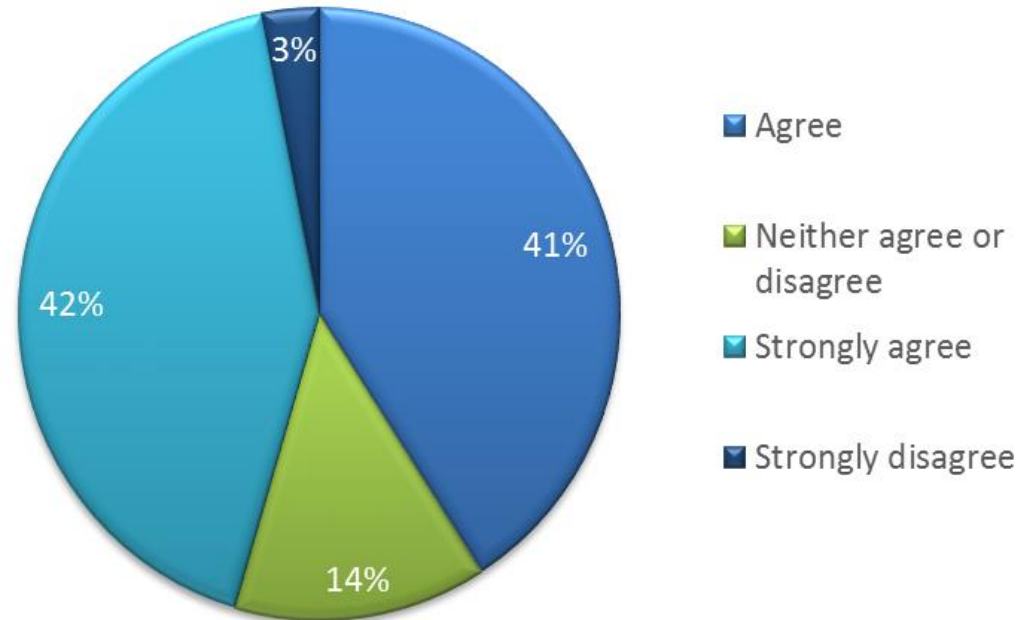


11. The school promotes positive images of ethnic minorities in newsletters and on the website.

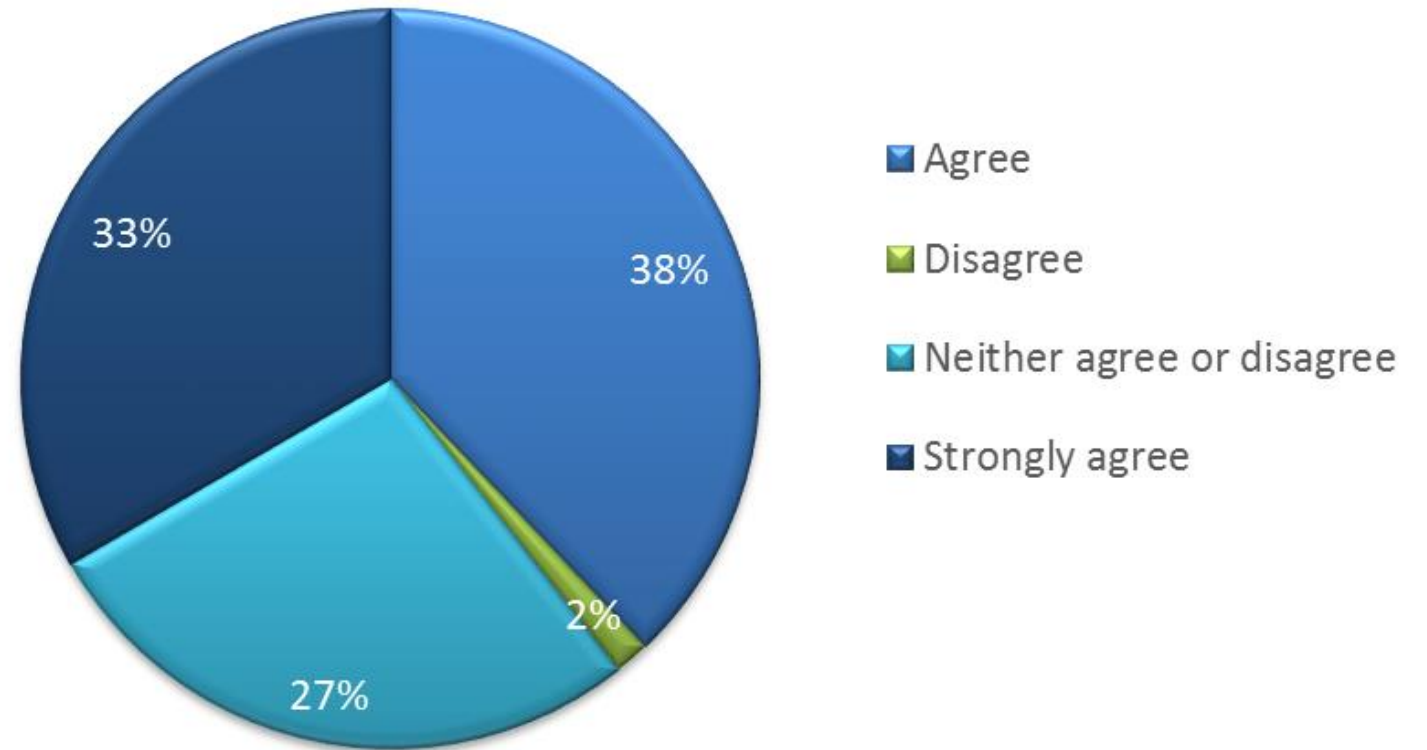

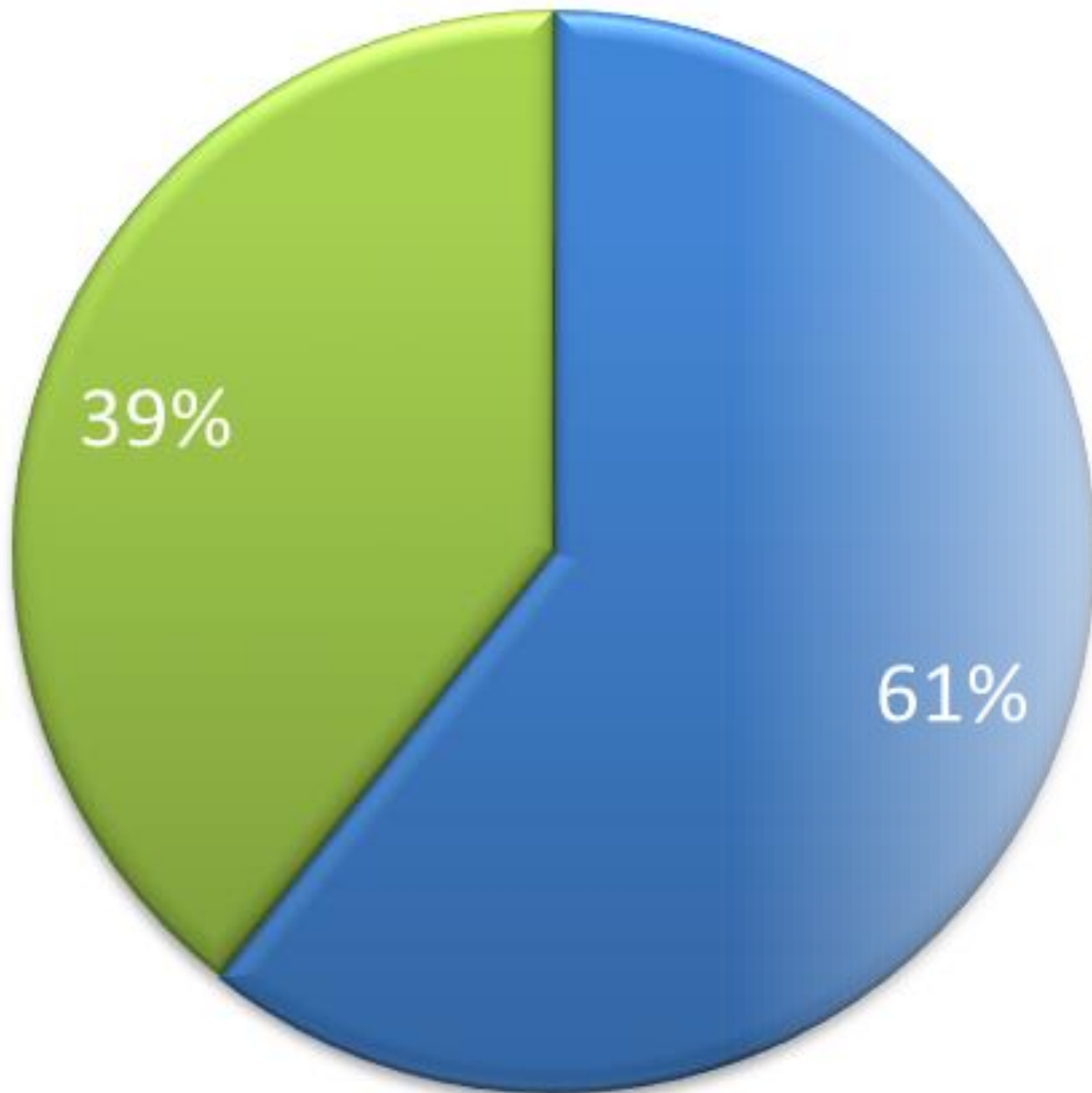

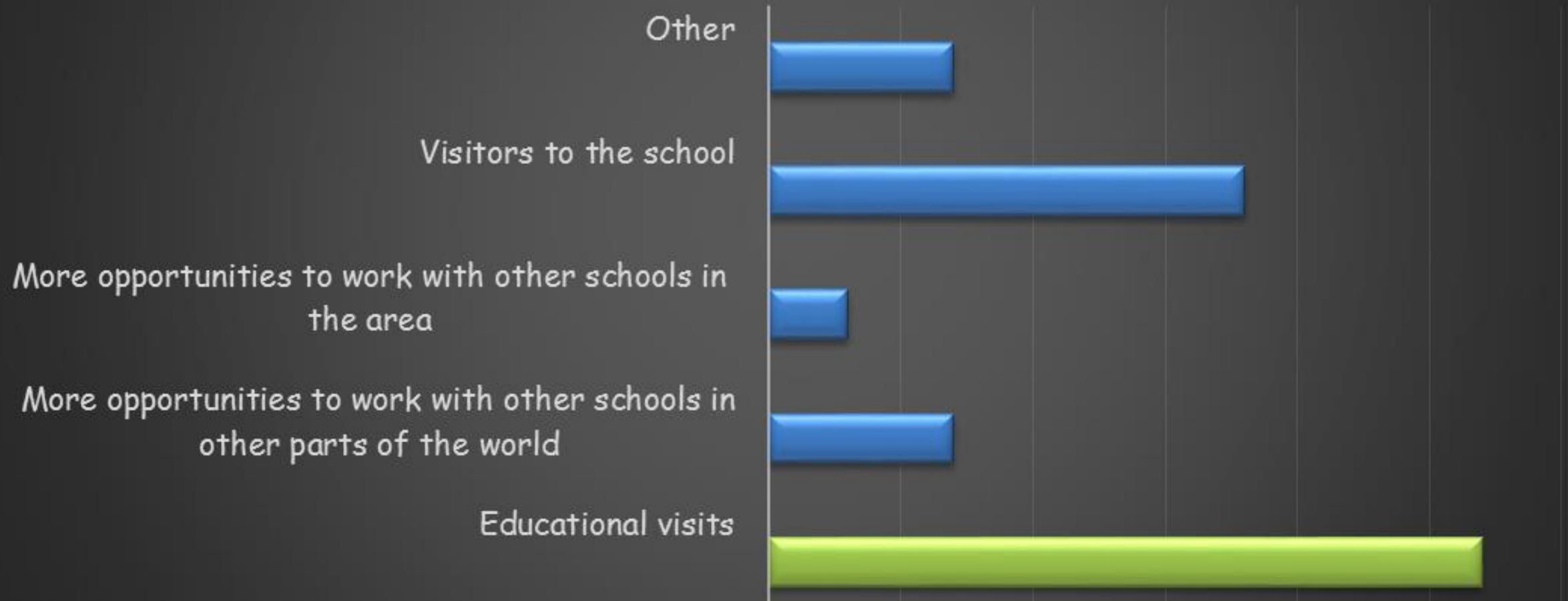
