Our Curriculum

At Ellistown Primary School we provide a dynamic and inspiring environment where children grow, flourish and thrive.



We are proud to be an Everyone's Welcome: No Outsiders school. We celebrate diversity, individuality and respect, enabling each child to fully develop their skills, talents and interests as well as a positive self image.

Our curriculum is underpinned by our four key aims

- Every child a reader
- Being good citizens
- A love for learning and being curious
- Learning behaviours for success

In Reception and Key Stage 1 we use a continuous provision model which give children the opportunity to be active participants in their learning, making it enjoyable and stimulating. In addition it challenges children to overcome problems in a wide range of contexts which builds confidence, independence and creative and critical thinking skills.

Our curriculum provides children with the opportunity to think often and deeply. Most importantly, it provides children with the skills for learning that will continue for a lifetime.

The Wider Curriculum

At Ellistown, it is important to us to make sure that our children, throughout their time with us, will experience a wide range of different experiences and opportunities.

For us, education is not just restricted to the core subjects and shouldn't be restricted to the classroom. With this firmly held belief, we plan exciting enrichment opportunities which enhance the national curriculum, embed learning and life skills and of course wonderful memories for life.

We often have special visitors come into school who will share their specialist knowledge or talent with us in class workshops. Every year, each class will take part in at least one educational visit to enrich the curriculum and classroom learning.

Each year children are given the opportunity to perform in front of an audience, through drama and music.

We have a fantastic outdoor learning space, and each class will take part in a Forest School afternoon every 6 weeks.

In Key Stage 2 we support a 1:1 ipad project, allowing parents to purchase an ipad at a subsidised rate. Children use these in class and at home to enrich learning and build skills for life.

At our school, children are lucky enough to have the opportunity to go on residential visits twice in KS2.

At Ellistown Primary, learning really is fun.



Behaviour Policy

Be Respectful, Be Ready, Be Responsible, Be Safe

At Ellistown Primary School, we want to create an environment that is safe, where everyone feels respected and where students come into each lesson ready to engage in learning. We are a restorative community.

Restorative approaches help develop a happier school where the focus is on learning not conflict. Every member of our school community should feel safe and respected and will know that when things go wrong we will do everything we can to help put it right.

Restorative approaches encourage people to think about how their behaviour has affected others. This approach helps children to develop respect, responsibility and truth telling.

If your child has been upset we will try our very best to make sure they feel that it has been put right for them and that it will not happen again.

If a child has done something which has caused harm to another they will have the opportunity to repair this harm in a meaningful way.

Those children who are recognised each week for impeccable behaviour are invited to Hot Chocolate Friday with our Headteacher...A real treat!



Attendance

Regularly attending school is linked to raising children's achievement, as well as developing skills for life and work.

We are very lucky in that our families place high value on their child's education and understand how important good attendance in school is, both from an academic point of view, but also from a social point of view. As a school we work hard to ensure that Ellistown School is a place where children want to be, thus making parents job that little bit easier when they are encouraging children out of bed in the morning.

Good attendance is a learned behaviour, so it is important to develop good patterns of attendance from the outset.

We believe that working together with parents is the best way to promote positive attendance. We ask that parents and carers ensure that their child attends school regularly and arrives ready to learn.

Opportunities for All

We recognise that every pupil is unique. Therefore, we work together to make sure the needs of all children are met on an individual basis.

Teachers plan carefully to cater for all abilities, ensuring that all pupils are provided with challenging learning activities, experience success, and make progress.

Early identification of children with Special Educational or Additional Needs allows us to offer those pupils support from the start of their school journey with us. We work with parents to make sure that support is maintained, monitored, and reviewed for as long as deemed necessary.

Wraparound Care

At Ellistown, wraparound childcare provision exists to provide high quality out-of-school hours childcare for our parents. It provides a range of stimulating and creative activities in a safe environment.

The Breakfast club operates from 7.15am – 8.45am . Toast or cereal will be provided if your child arrives before 8.15 am.

Our “Honey Pot” after school provision runs from 3.15pm – 5.45pm during term time. Our fantastic team provide a range of stimulating, fun activities each afternoon, as well as running regular theme nights which are always very popular.

School Lunches

All of our school meals are cooked on-site. Our wonderful catering staff have achieved a 5-star food hygiene rating, and provide a wide variety of delicious meals for children to choose from on a daily basis. All allergies and dietary requirements can be catered for.

If your child is in the foundation stage or key stage one these are free to all.

Children may bring a packed lunch if preferred. Pack lunches should contain a healthy, well balanced meal (no sweets or fizzy drinks please.) We also request that foods sent into school are NUT FREE as we have several children with severe allergies.



Break Time Snacks

At breaktime all children are encouraged to have a healthy snack, this could be fruit, vegetables or a cereal bar.

Children in foundation stage or key stage one are provided with school fruit, in addition children receive a free carton of milk up to their fifth birthday. After they turn five this can be purchased at a subsidised rate.

Uniform

Our school uniform gives pupils a sense of unity and belonging.

All pupils are expected to have a school book bag as part of their uniform – we will provide a book bag for all pupils joining us in Reception at the start of the academic year. If a replacement is needed these can be purchased from our uniform provider.

Everyday

- white polo shirts
- black or grey trousers, skirt or pinafore dress
- navy sweatshirt or cardigan
- white, navy, black, or grey socks or tights
- black shoes or plain black trainers

In the summer blue gingham dresses or black or grey shorts may be worn.

All children will need wellies and suitable waterproof clothing available in school for outdoor use during Forest School and Welly Wednesday.



PE Kit:

Pupils should come to school wearing PE kit on PE days.

- navy or black jogging trousers, leggings or shorts
- a white t-shirt (no cropped tops)
- a royal blue hoodie.

Non branded items are preferred. Black trainers should be worn on PE days



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
