This year due to Covid19 and the need for more outdoor sports, we have invested in 2 table tennis tables and 2 KS1 basketball hoops in order to engage more pupils in sport at break and lunchtimes. We have also ordered enough balls so that every class can have one per child so that sports can safely continue if restrictions on sharing are still in place in September.
